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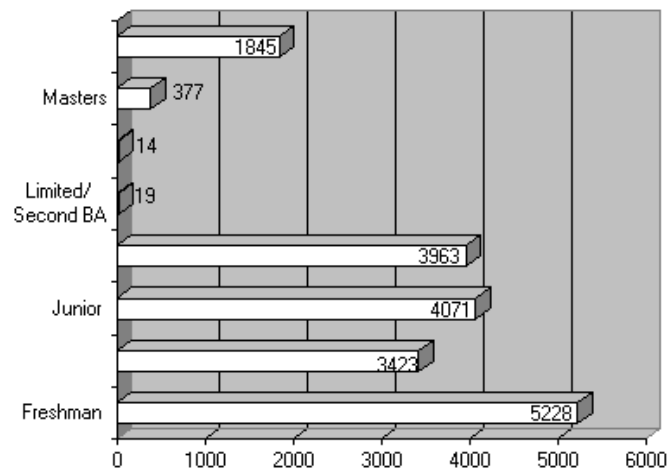

Total Student Enrollment



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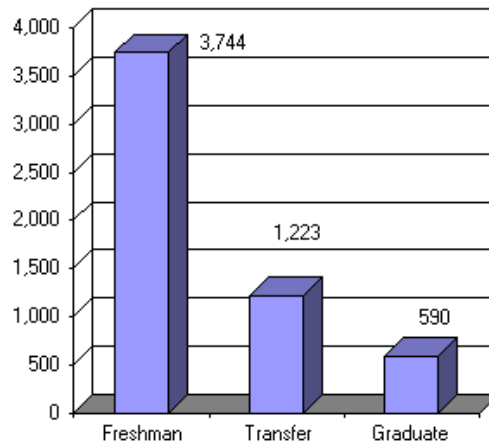

New Student Enrollment



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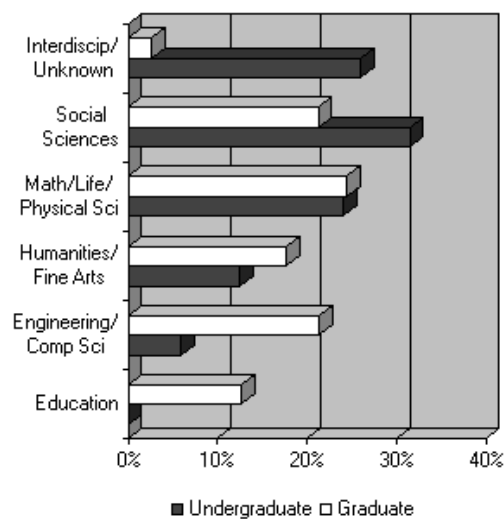

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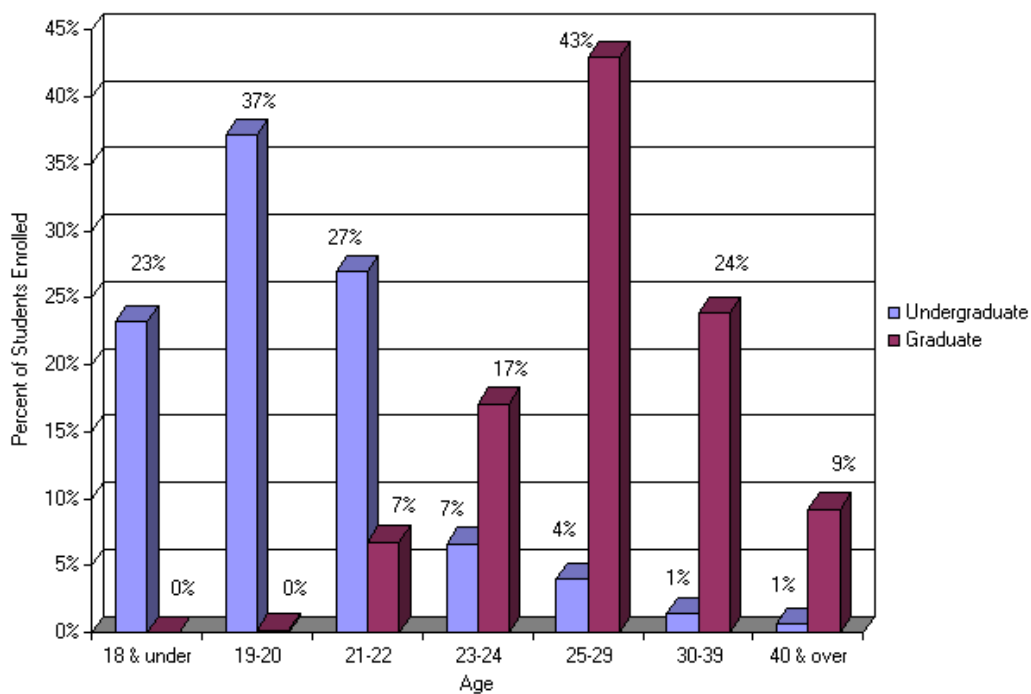

Age Distribution of Students by Class Level



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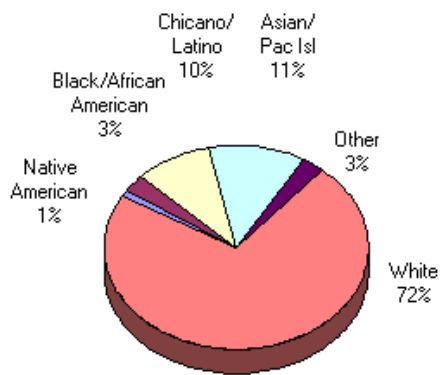
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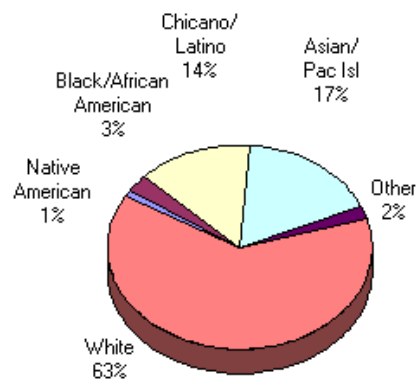

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UCSB School of Origin 1997-98

Of new undergraduates 75% entered as freshmen, while 25% transferred in at a higher class level. Eighty-one percent of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 17% graduated from private high schools. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (81%), a quarter of those from Santa Barbara City College alone; others came from other University of California campuses (5%), the California State University system (4%), and other colleges (10%).



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UCSB International Students 1997-98

UCSB's international students come from 60 different countries. Thirteen percent are from the People's Republic of China, 12% from Japan, 11% from Taiwan, followed by 10% from India and 9% from South Korea. Another 12% of international students came to UCSB from Germany, Norway, Turkey, Canada, Hong Kong, Brazil, and Israel.



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UCSB Students with Disabilities 1997-98

Three percent of undergraduate and graduate students report having a disability. Of those undergraduates reporting a disability, 47% have a learning disability, 21% are visually impaired, 7% are hearing impaired, 7% have a mobility impairment, and the other 18% report other disabilities. Thirty-three percent of graduate students with disabilities have a learning disability, 17% are visually impaired, 16% have a mobility impairment, 15% are hearing impaired, and another 19% report other disabilities.

Approximately 3% of undergraduates and 21% of graduate students are married.



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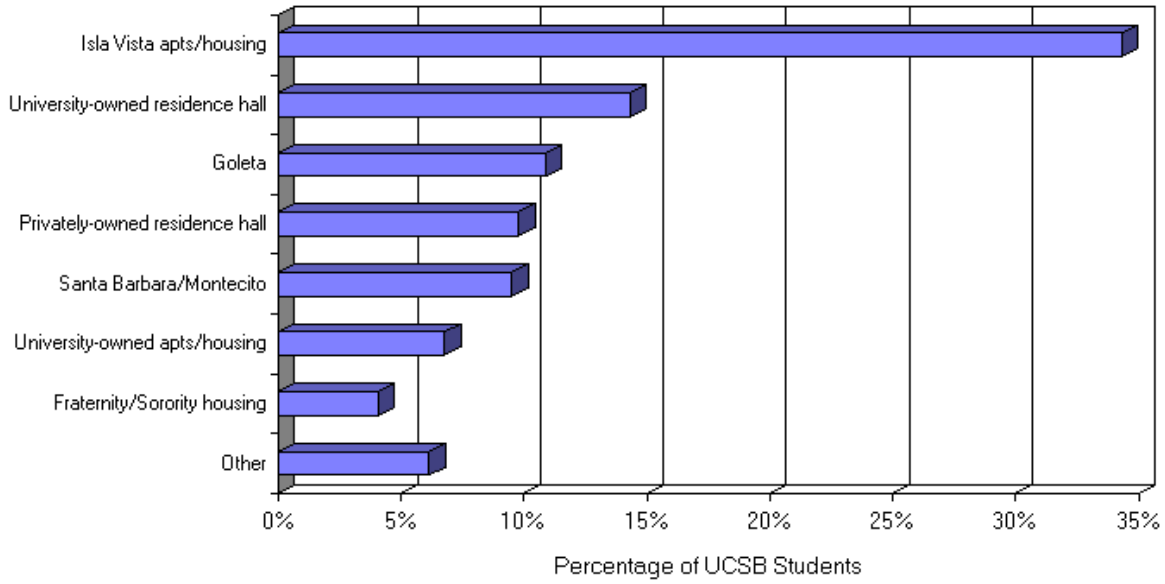

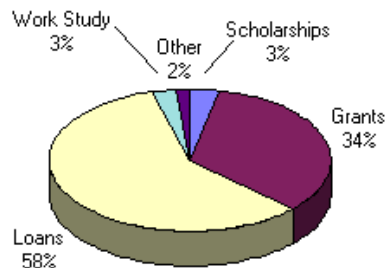
Fifty-nine percent of UCSB students received some form of financial aid through the university, including 55% of all undergraduates and 89% of all graduate students.

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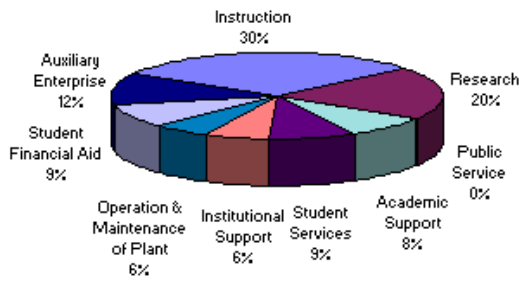

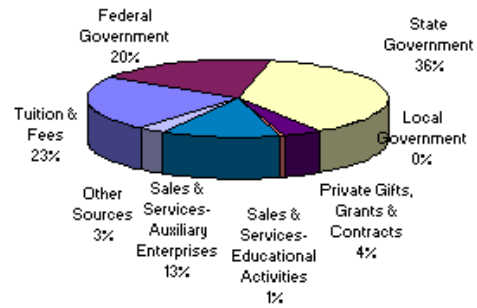
