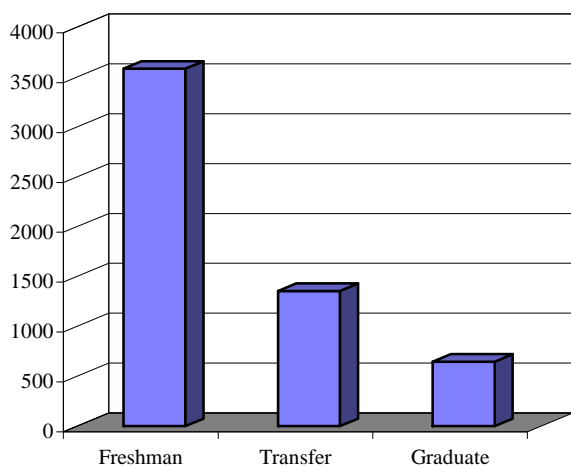

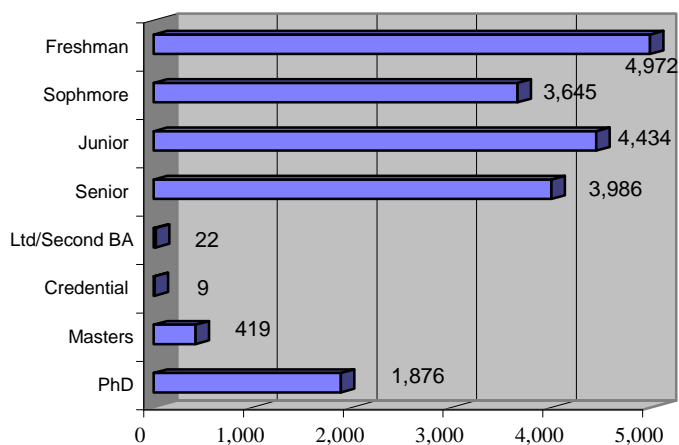

Total Student Enrollment



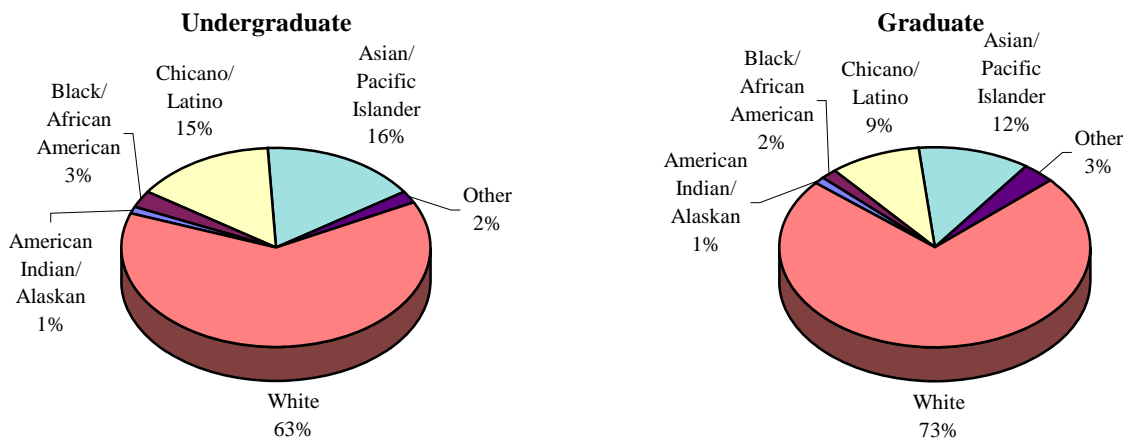

## Marital Status, Disabilities, School and Country of Origin

Approximately 3% of undergraduates and 21% of graduate students are married.

Three percent of undergraduate and two percent of graduate students report having a disability. Of those undergraduates reporting a disability, 48% have a learning disability, 22%, have a mobility or functional impairment, 19% are visually impaired, 6% are hearing impaired, and the other 4% report other disabilities. Thirty-five percent of graduate students with disabilities have a learning disability, 23% have a mobility or functional impairment, 23% are visually impaired, 17% are hearing impaired, and another 2% report other disabilities.

UCSB's international students come from 65 different countries. The top five originating countries are the People's Republic of China (15%), India (11%), Japan (11%), Taiwan (10%), and South Korea (7%). Another 12% of international students came to UCSB from Germany, Turkey, Canada, Brazil, and Mexico.

Of new undergraduates 73% entered as freshmen, while 27% transferred in at a higher class level. Eighty-one percent of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 16% graduated from private high schools. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (81%), almost a quarter of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (22%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (4%), the California State University system (3%), and other colleges (11%).

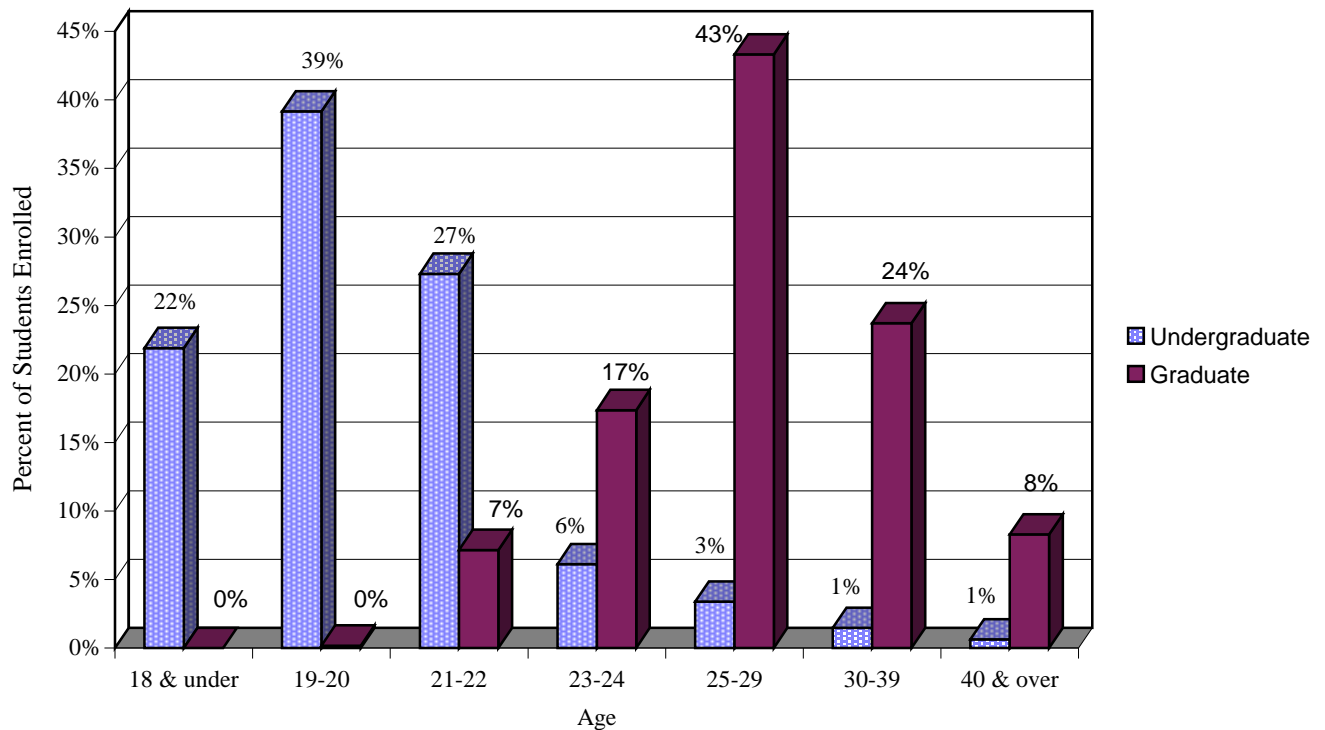

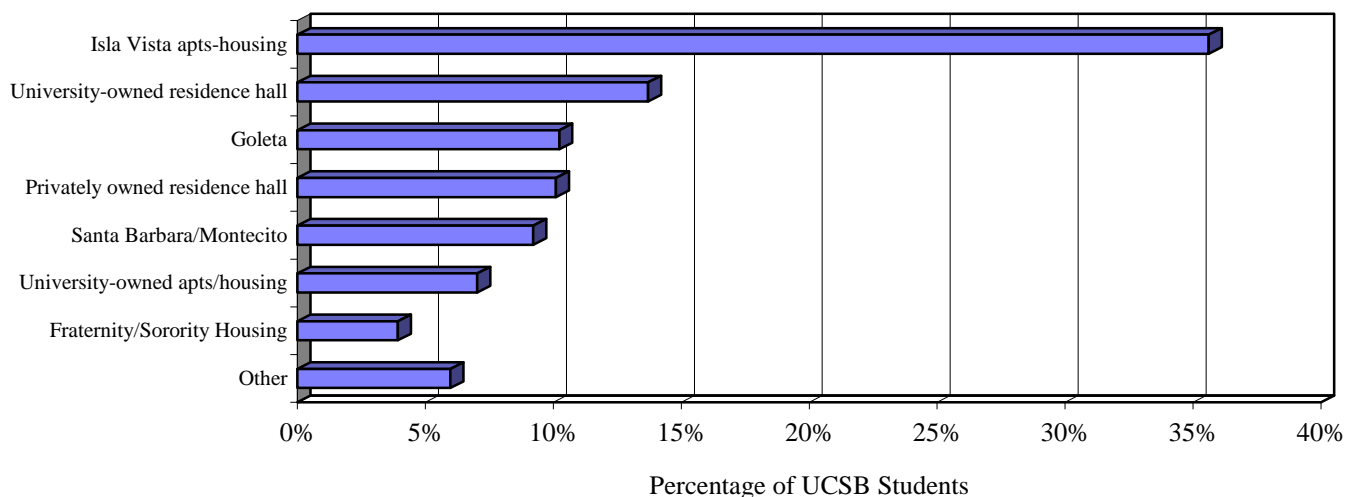

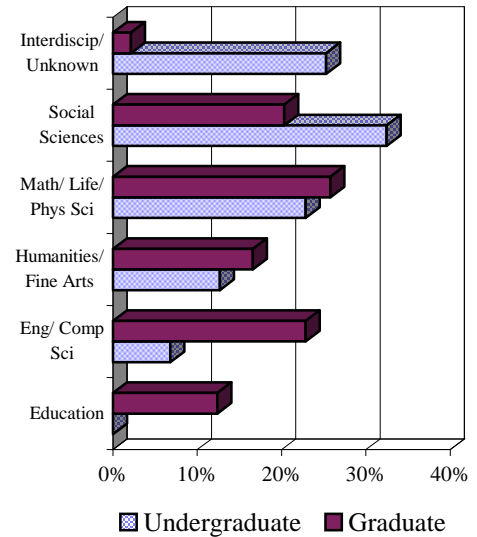
**Where UCSB Students Live**

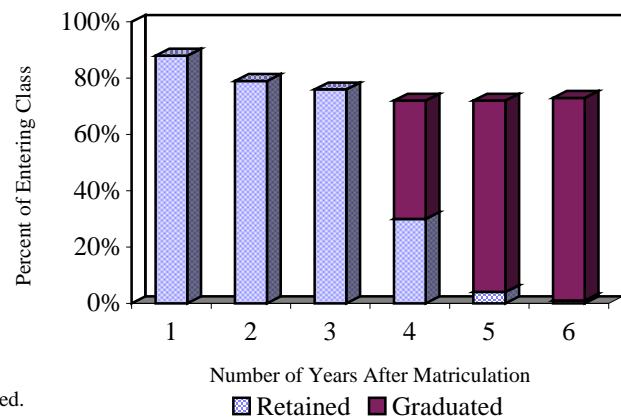

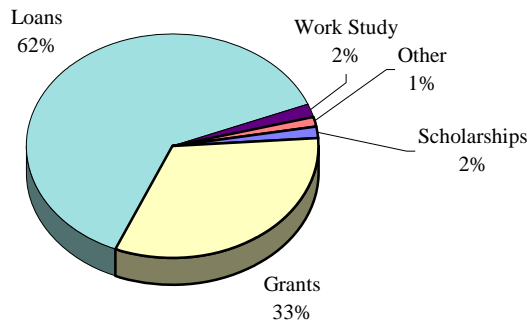

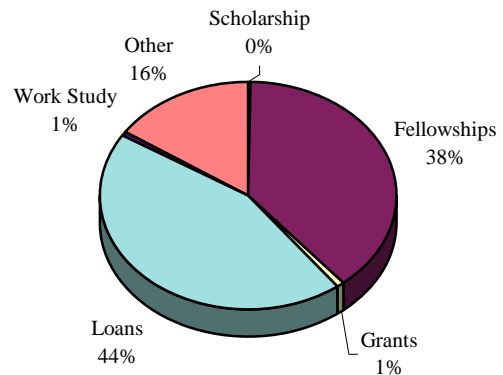
Fall 1992 Freshmen Retention/Graduation Rate

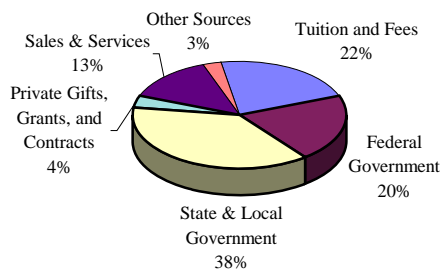
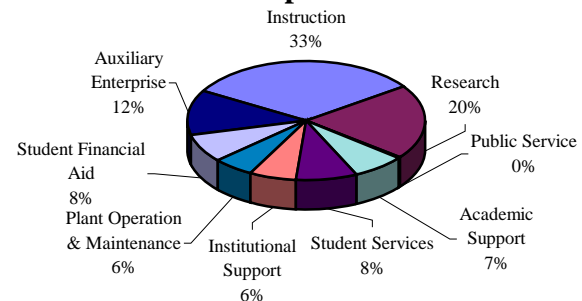
