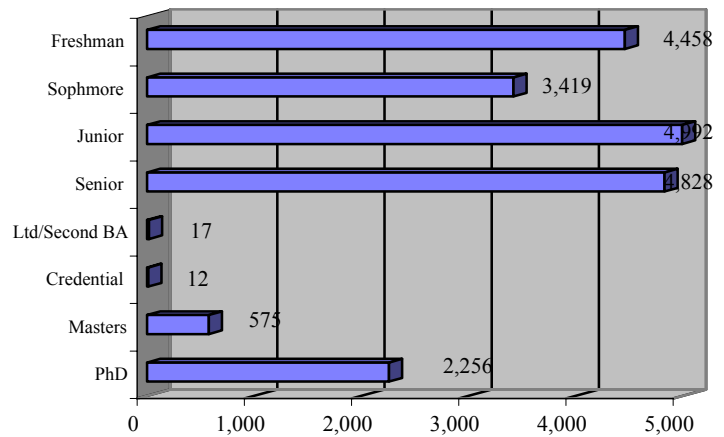

## School of Origin

Of new undergraduates 74% entered as freshmen, while 26% transferred in at a higher class level. Eighty-three percent of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 15% graduated from private high schools. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (85%), a quarter of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (24%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (9%), the California State University system (1%), and other colleges (4%).

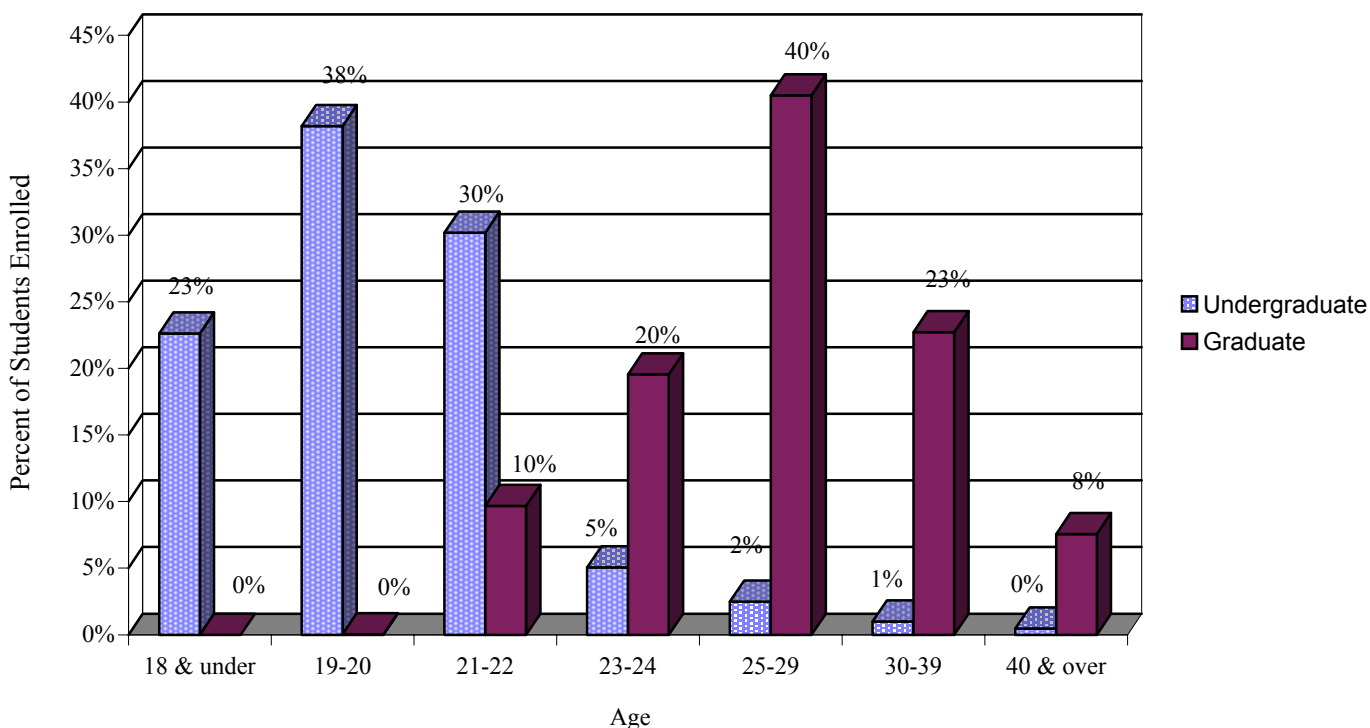

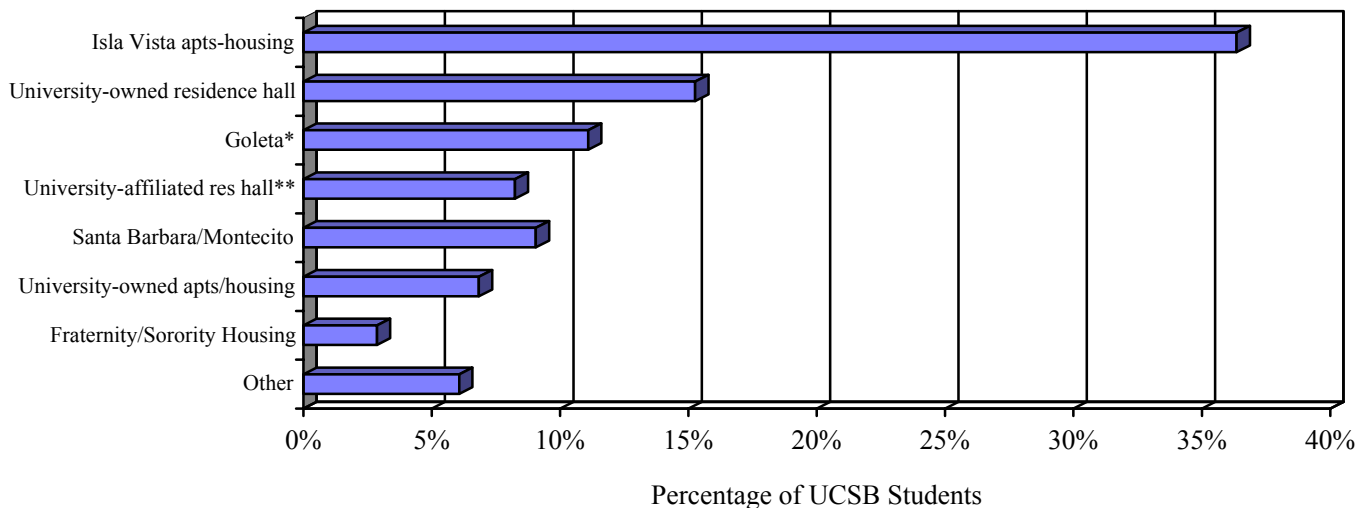

**Where UCSB Students Live**



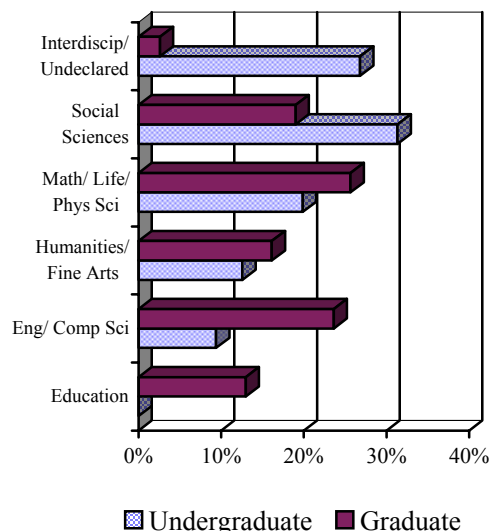

Major Disciplines of UCSB Students



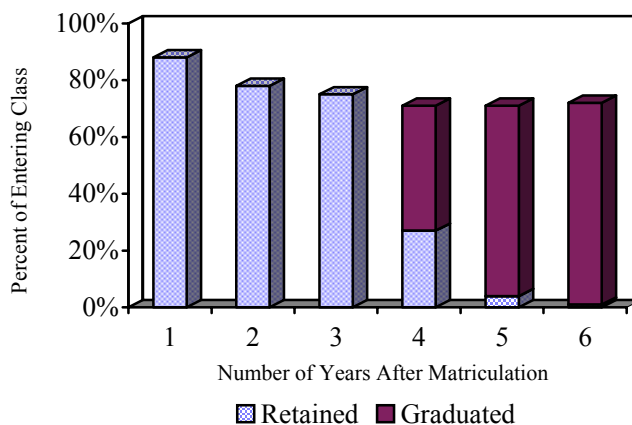

Fall 1996 Freshmen Retention/ Graduation Rate

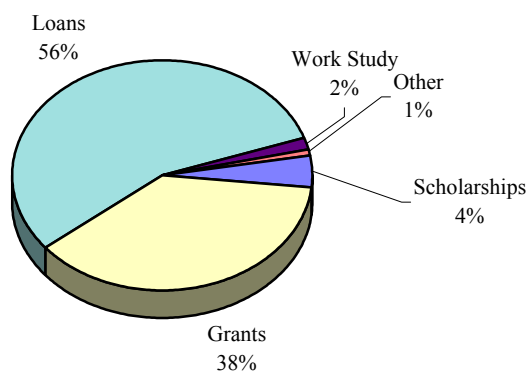

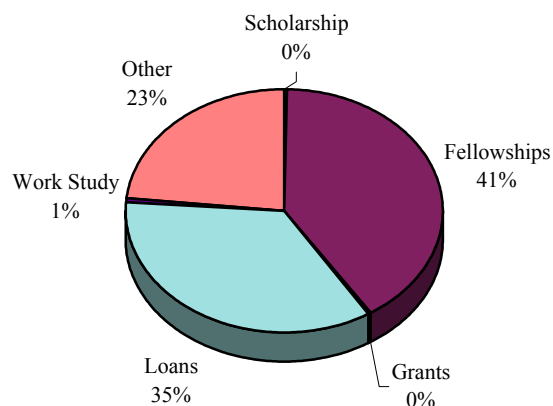

There are currently 334 Regents Scholars receiving funding, 83 of whom are new students. Of the 45 National Merit Scholars, 18 are new students.

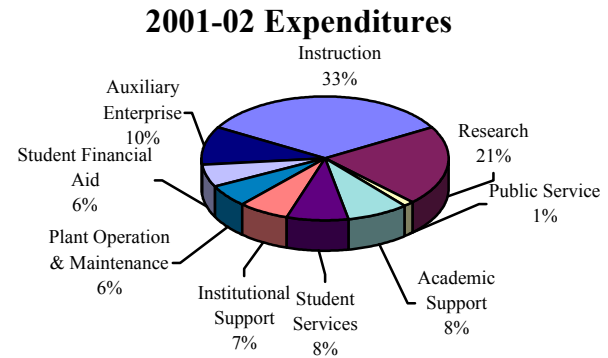
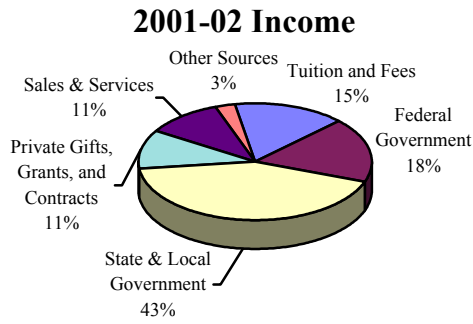
