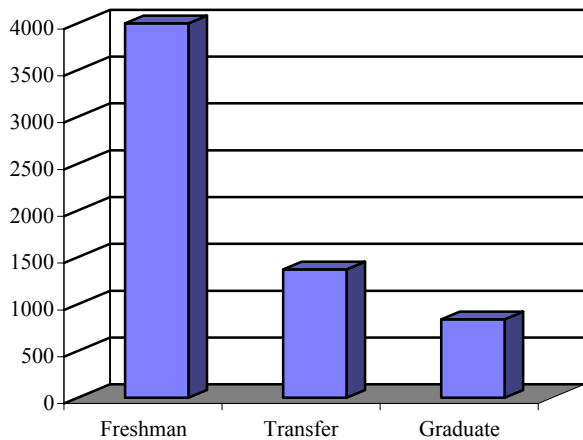

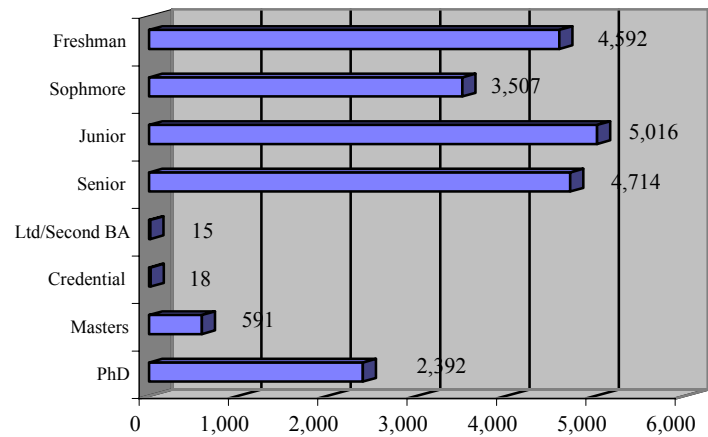

School of Origin

Of new undergraduates 74% entered as freshmen, while 26% transferred in at a higher class level. Eighty-four percent of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 15% graduated from private high schools. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (90%), over a quarter of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (28%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (4%), the California State University system (1%), and other colleges (4%).

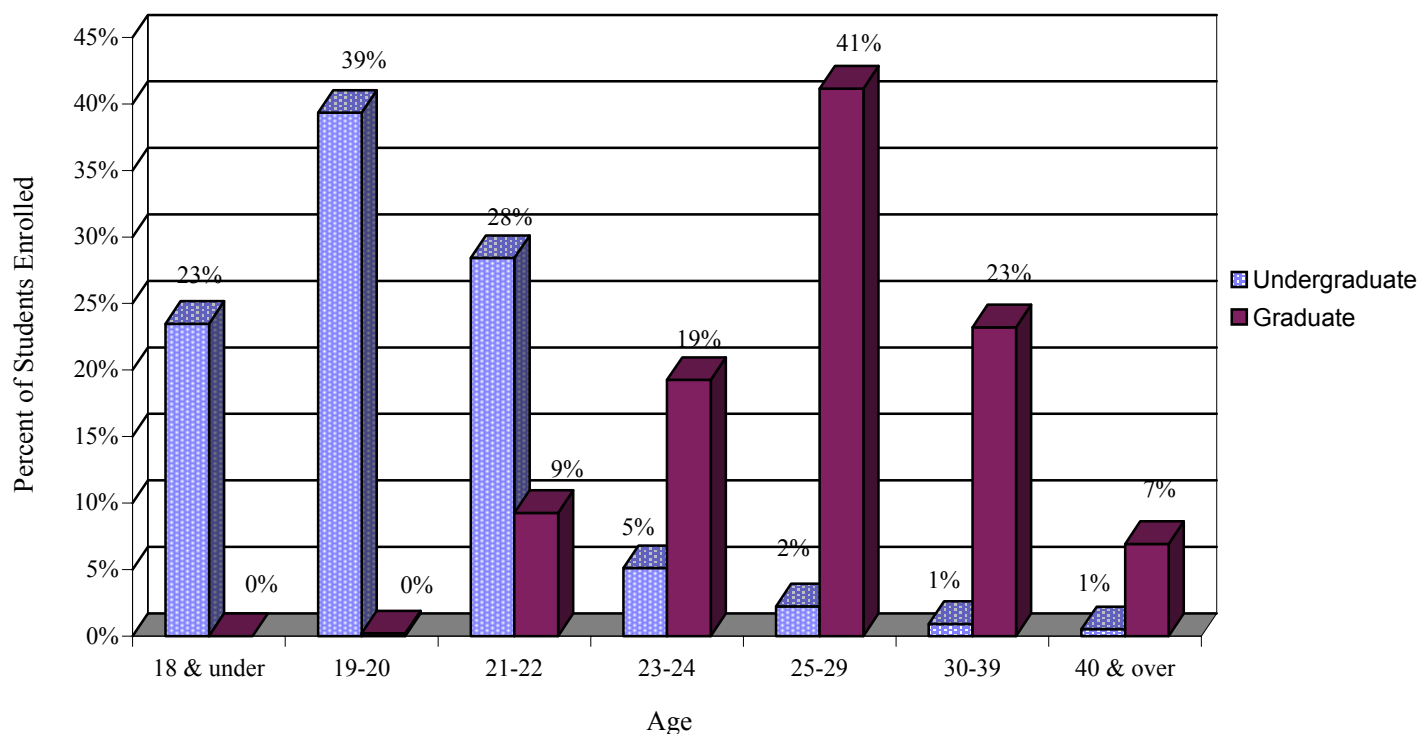

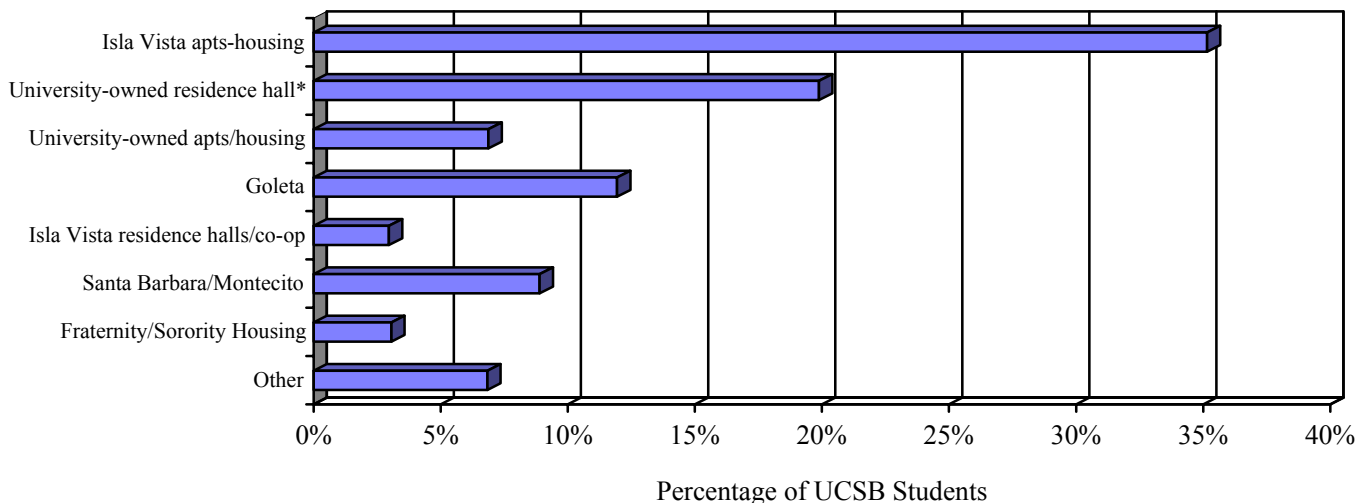

Where UCSB Students Live

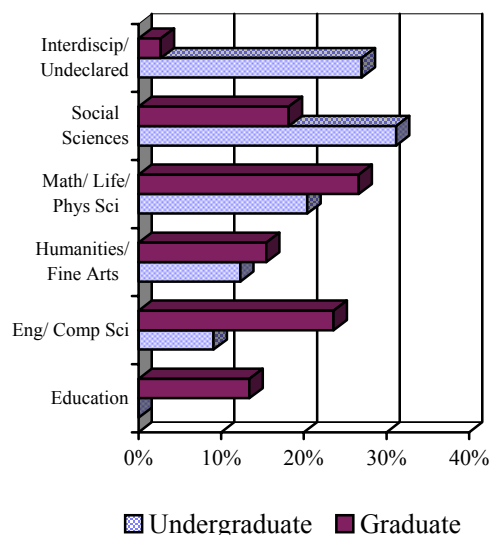

Major Disciplines of UCSB Students



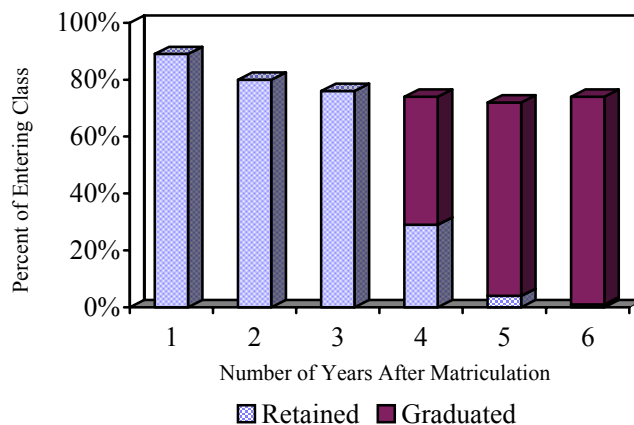

Fall 1997 Freshmen Retention/ Graduation Rate

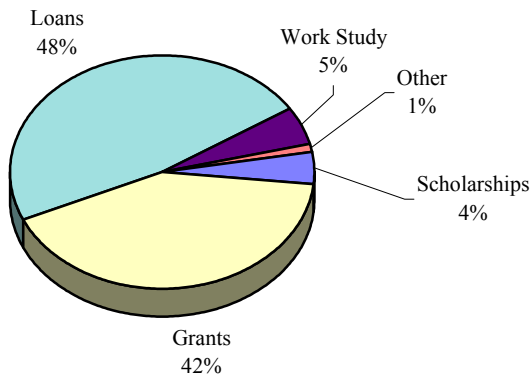

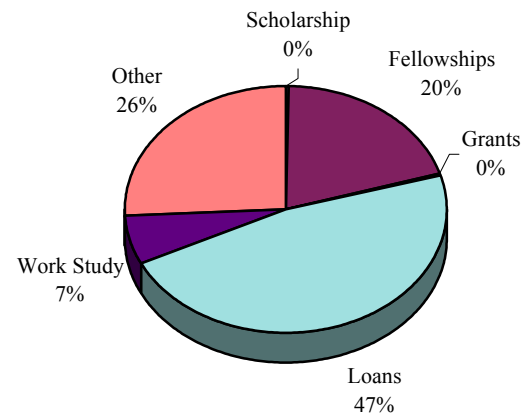

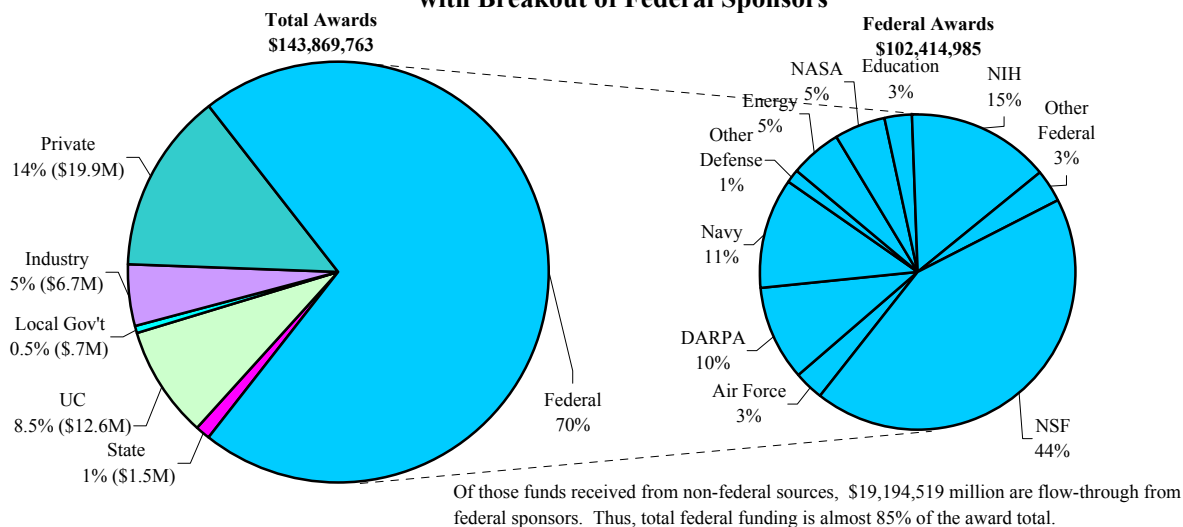

with Breakout of Federal Sponsors



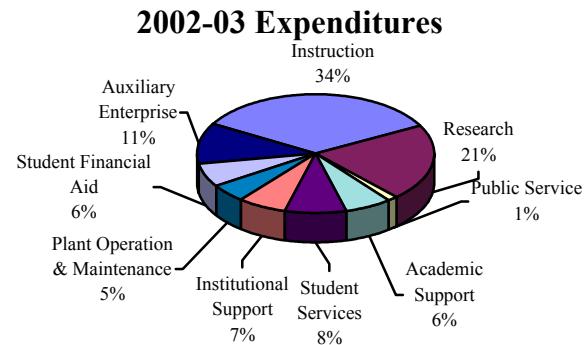
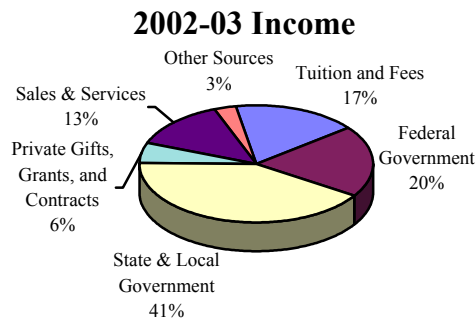
