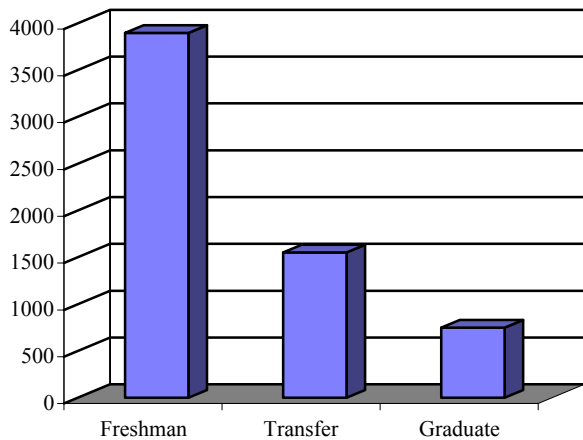

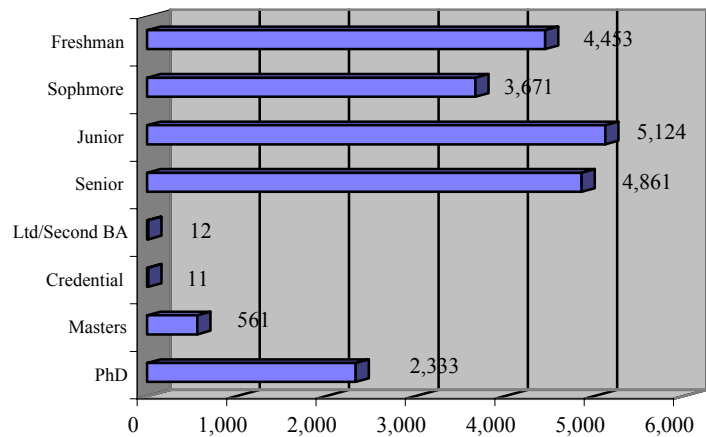

Fall Enrollment by Class Level

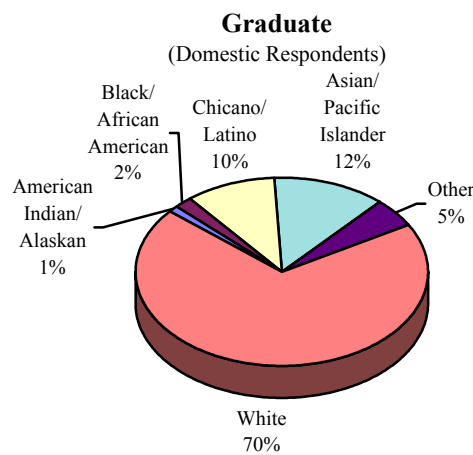
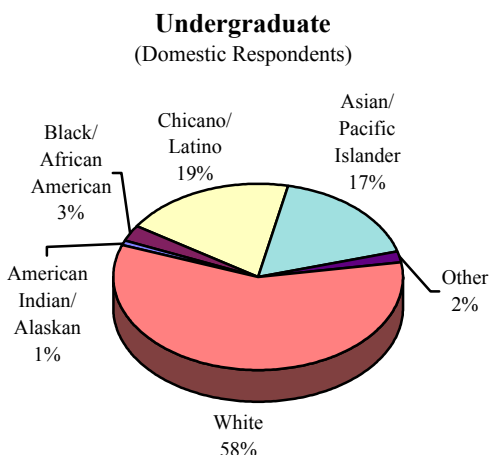

School of Origin

Of new undergraduates 72% entered as freshmen, while 28% transferred in at a higher class level. Eighty-four percent of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 15% graduated from private high schools. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (93%), nearly a quarter of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (24%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (3%), the California State University system (1%), and other colleges (3%).

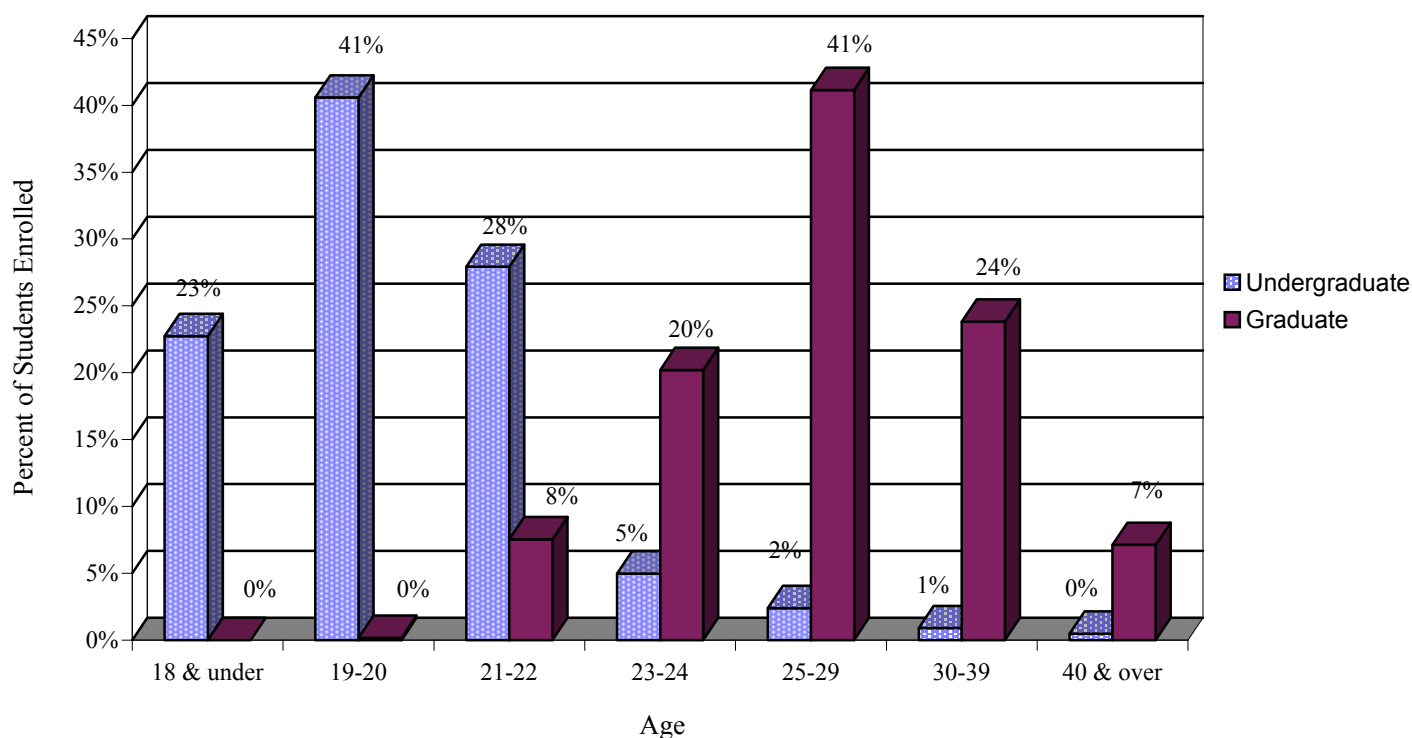

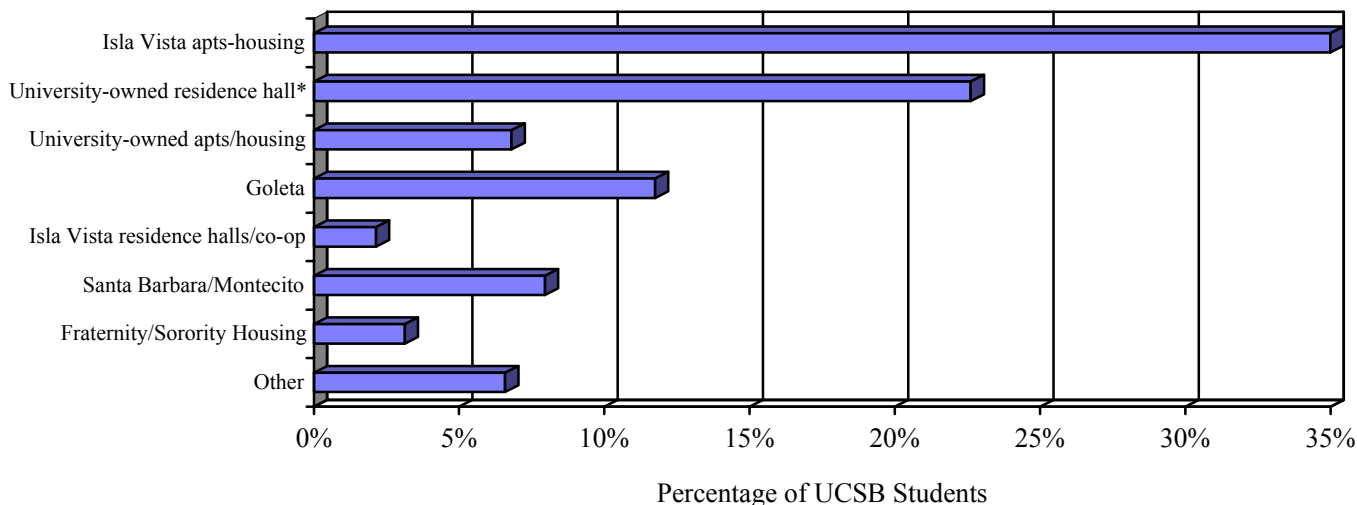

Where UCSB Students Live

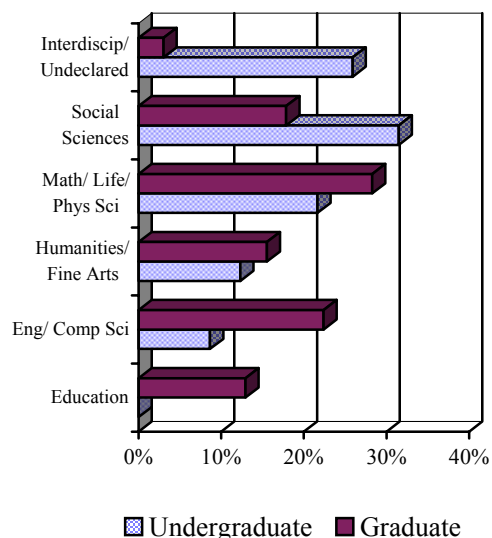

Major Disciplines of UCSB Students



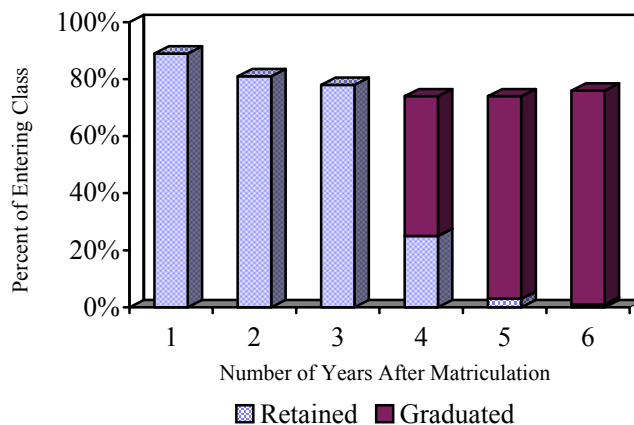

Fall 1998 Freshmen Retention/ Graduation Rate



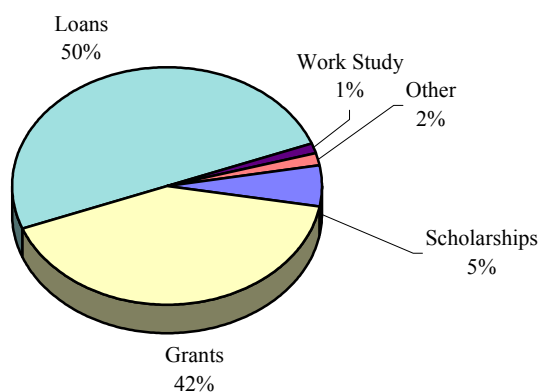

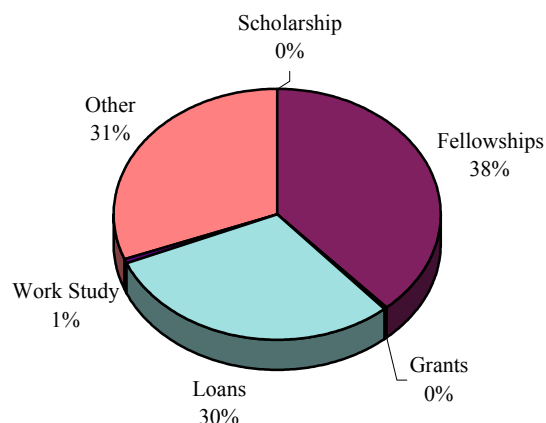

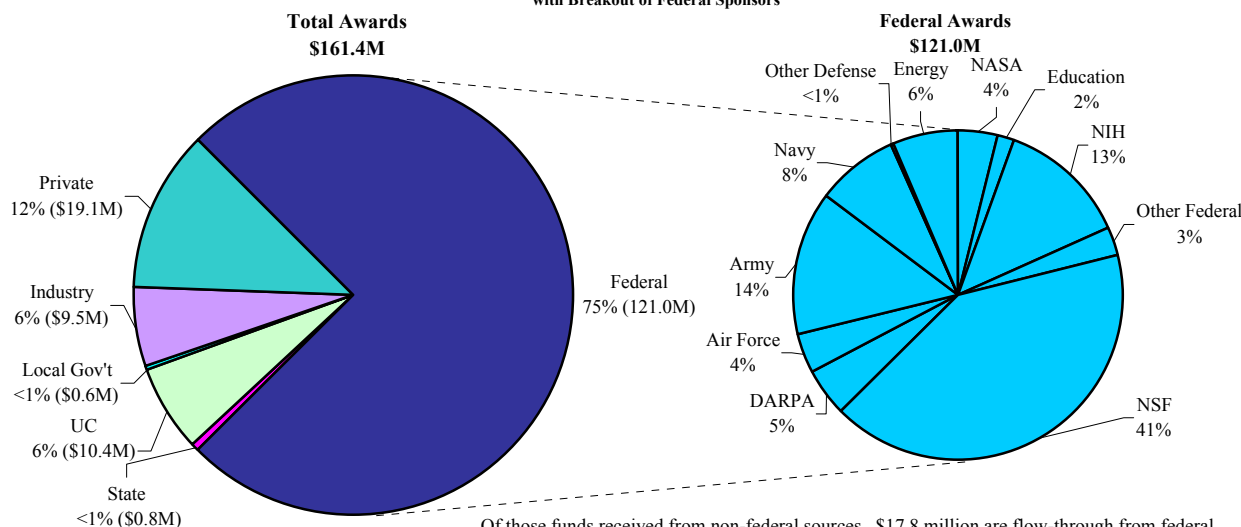

with Breakout of Federal Sponsors



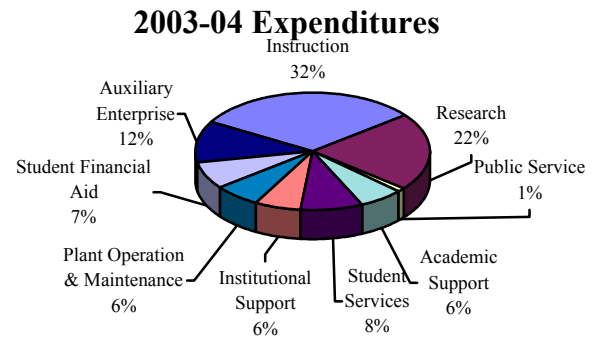
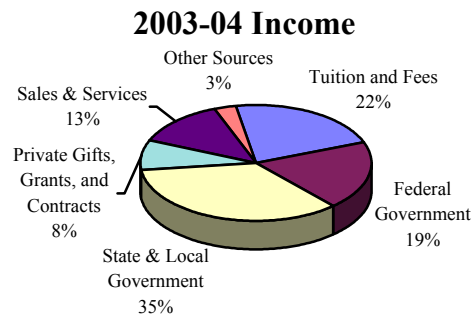
