## School of Origin

Of new undergraduates 75% entered as freshmen, while 25% transferred in at a higher class level. 84% of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 9% graduated from private high schools or were home schooled. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (94%); about one fifth of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (19%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (2%), the California State University system (1%), and other 4-year colleges (2%).

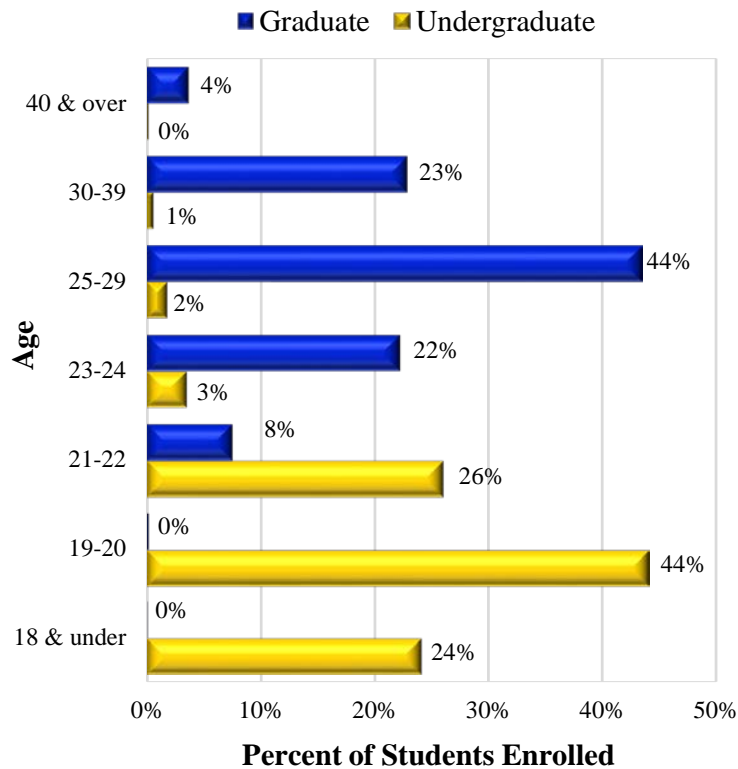

**Age Distribution of Students by Class Level**



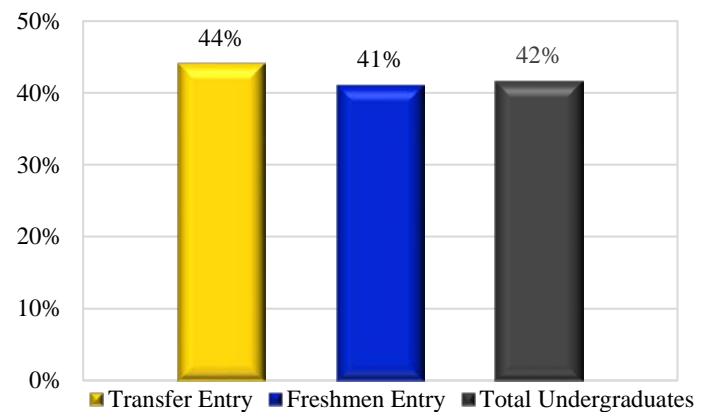

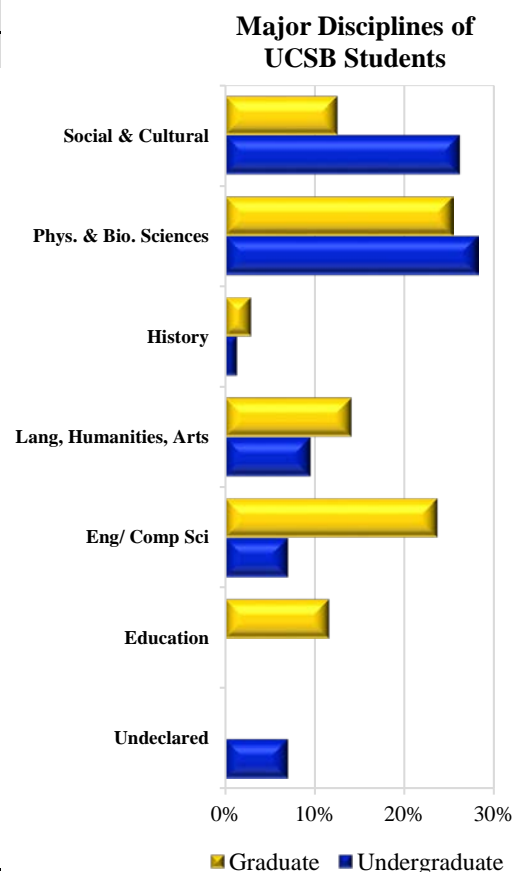

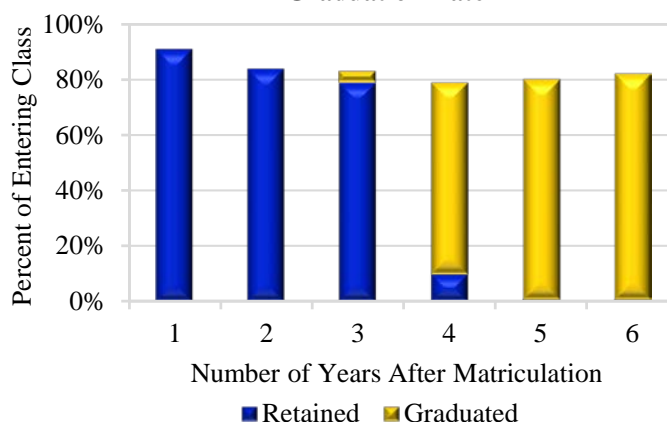

Fall 2008 Freshmen Cohort Retention/ Graduation Rate



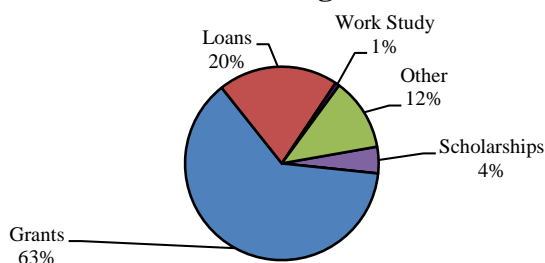

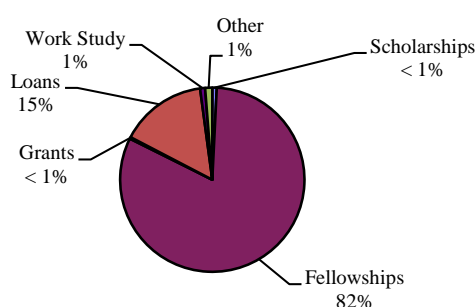
