## School of Origin

Of new undergraduates 71% entered as freshmen, while 29% transferred in at a higher class level. 80% of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 11% graduated from private high schools or were home schooled. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (95%); about one fifth of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (21%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (2%), the California State University system (1%), and other 4-year colleges (2%).

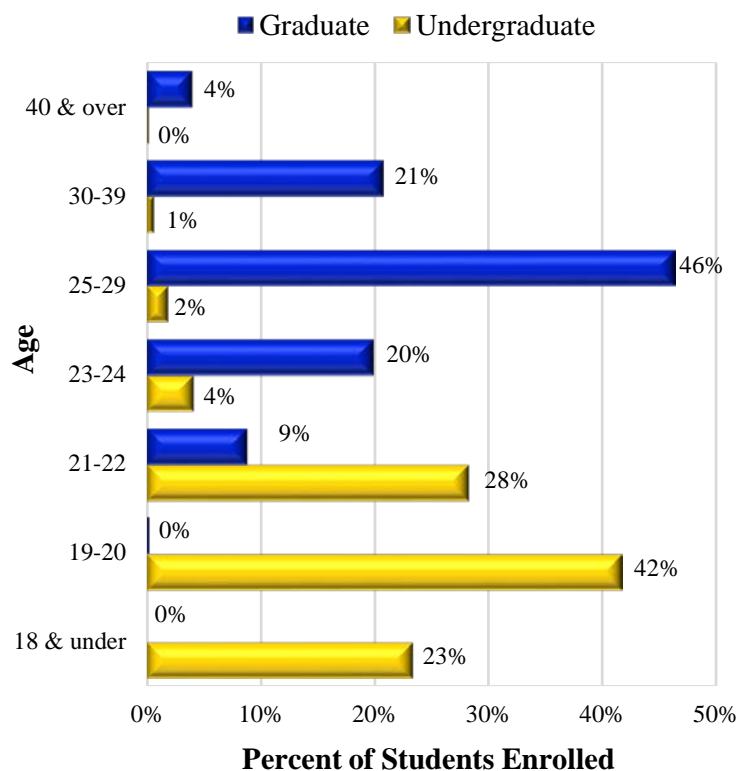

Age Distribution of Students by Class Level



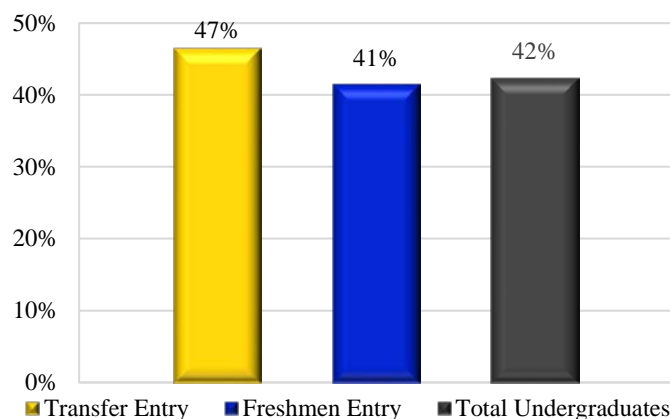

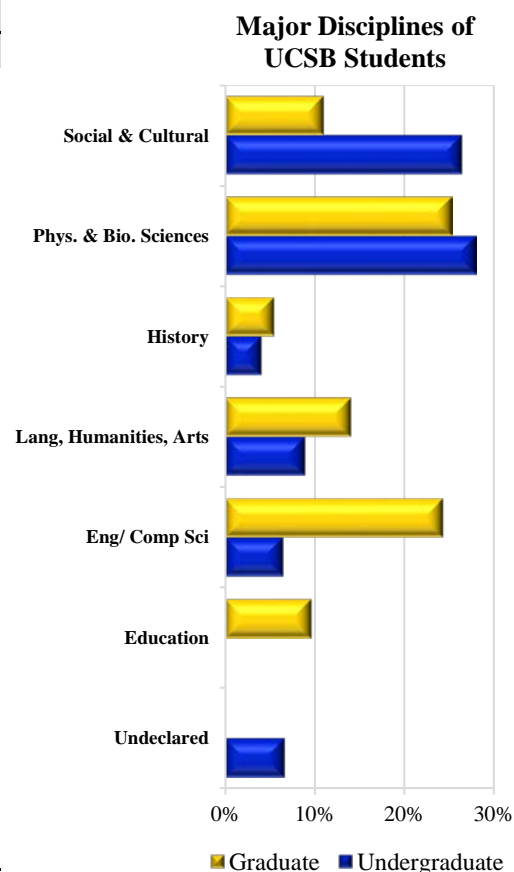

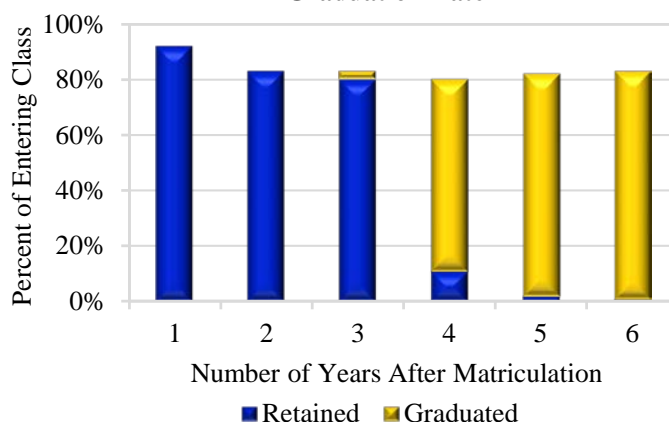

### Fall 2010 Freshmen Cohort Retention/ Graduation Rate



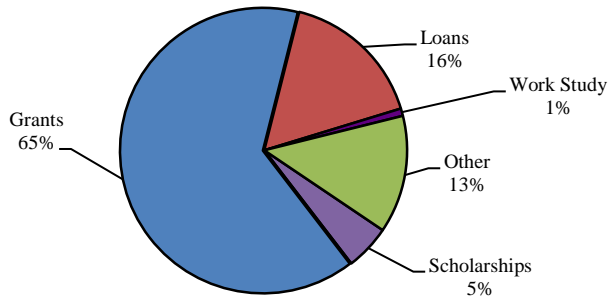

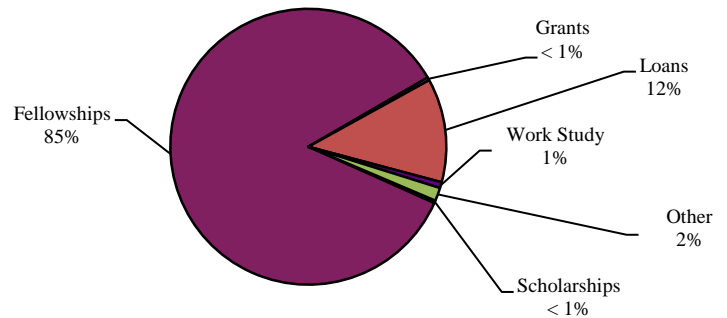

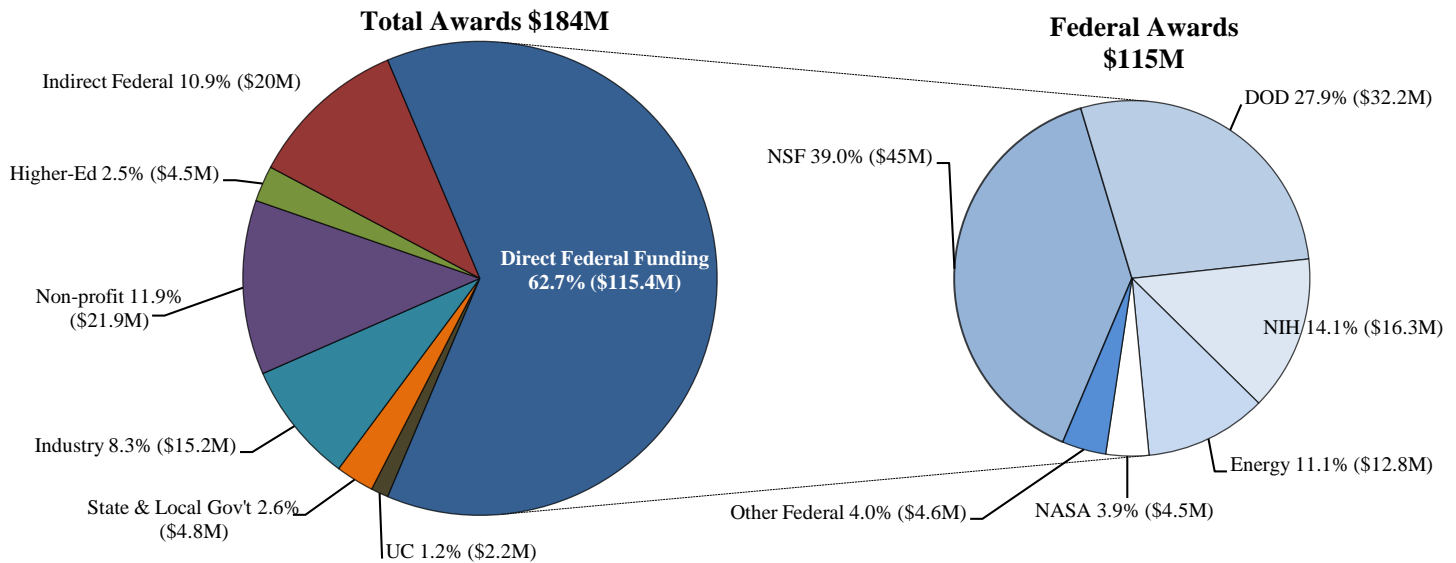
