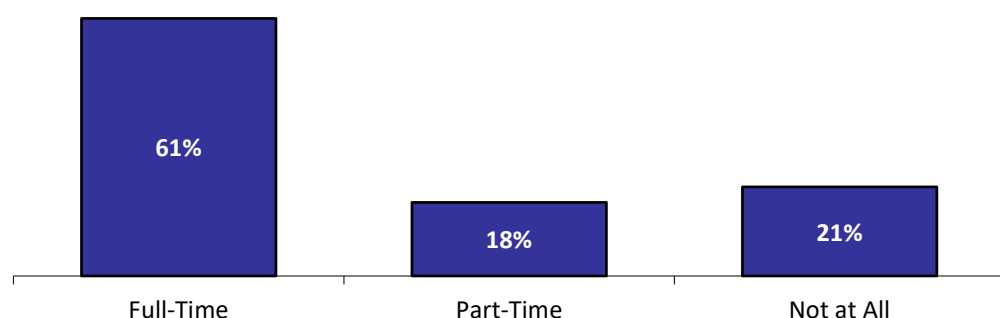

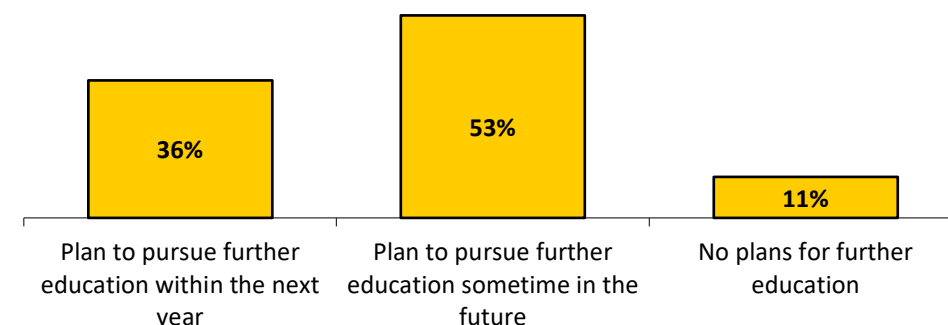
Employment Trajectories

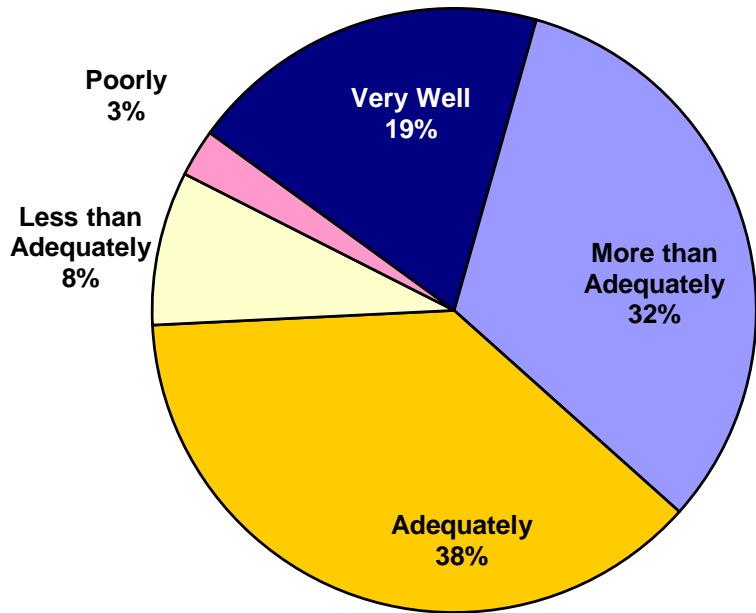
The UCSB Graduating Senior survey is part of an ongoing effort to assess the short-term impact of a UCSB undergraduate education on the achievements and opinions of exiting seniors. This survey has been administered intermittently since Spring 2002. However, since Spring 2015, the survey has been administered on a quarterly basis and an open link to the survey has been included on the graduation checklist for seniors. A total of 2,329 graduating seniors completed the survey for an overall response rate of 26%.

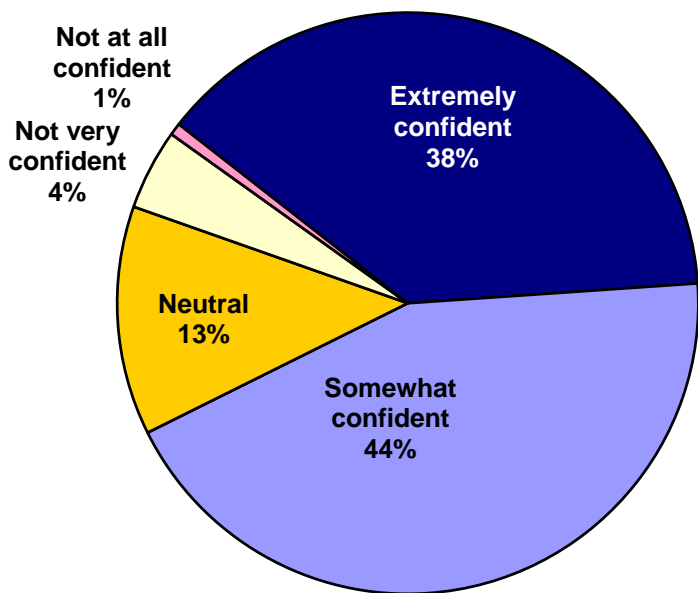
FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES

How confident are you that you will achieve a satisfying career?



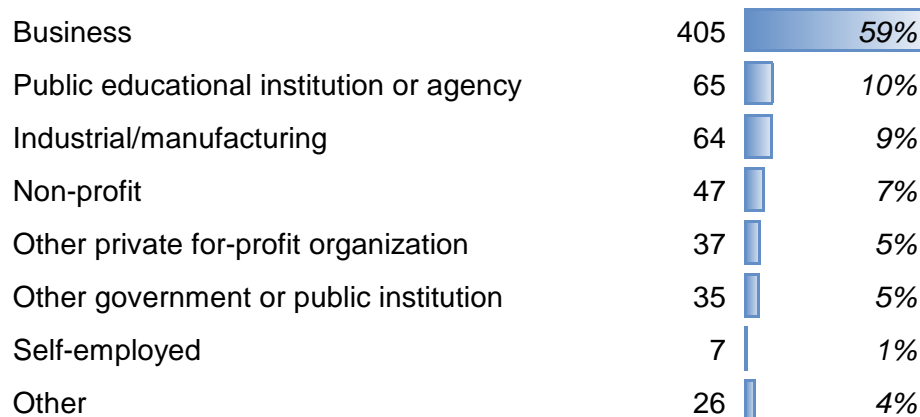
About 8 out of 10 of respondents are "extremely confident" or "somewhat confident" that they will achieve a satisfying career.

How closely is this position related to your undergraduate major(s)?



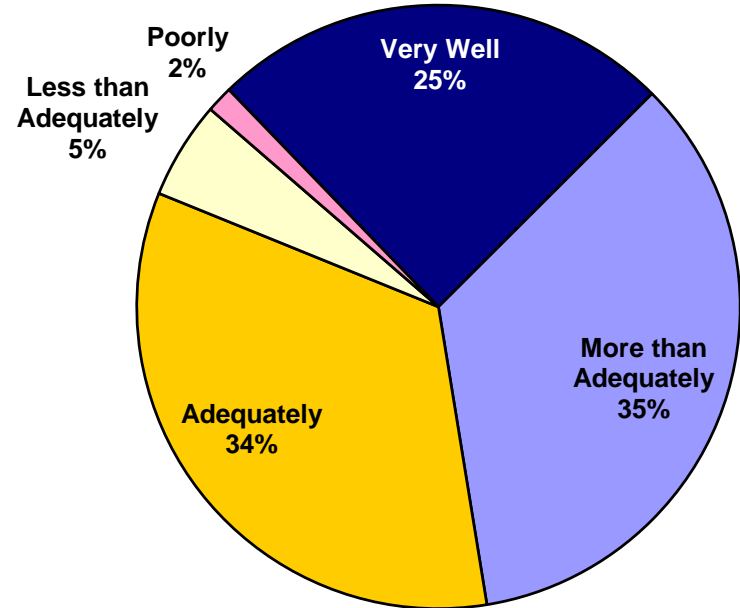
In what type of organization or sector will you work?

How well did UCSB prepare you for graduate or professional school?

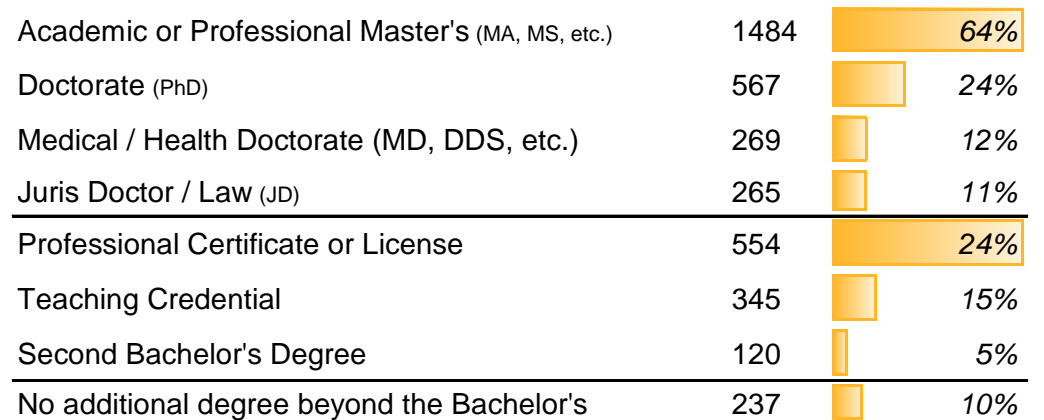


Almost two-thirds of post-graduate degree-seekers surveyed say that UCSB prepared them "very well" or "more than adequately" for graduate school.

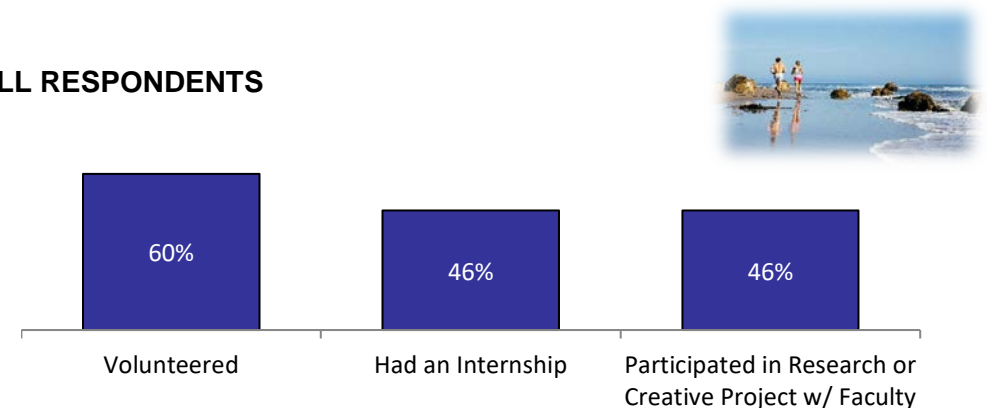
What is the highest degree you expect to receive?

- 60% of graduating seniors surveyed participated in community service during the past year. One-fifth volunteered on a weekly basis or more often.

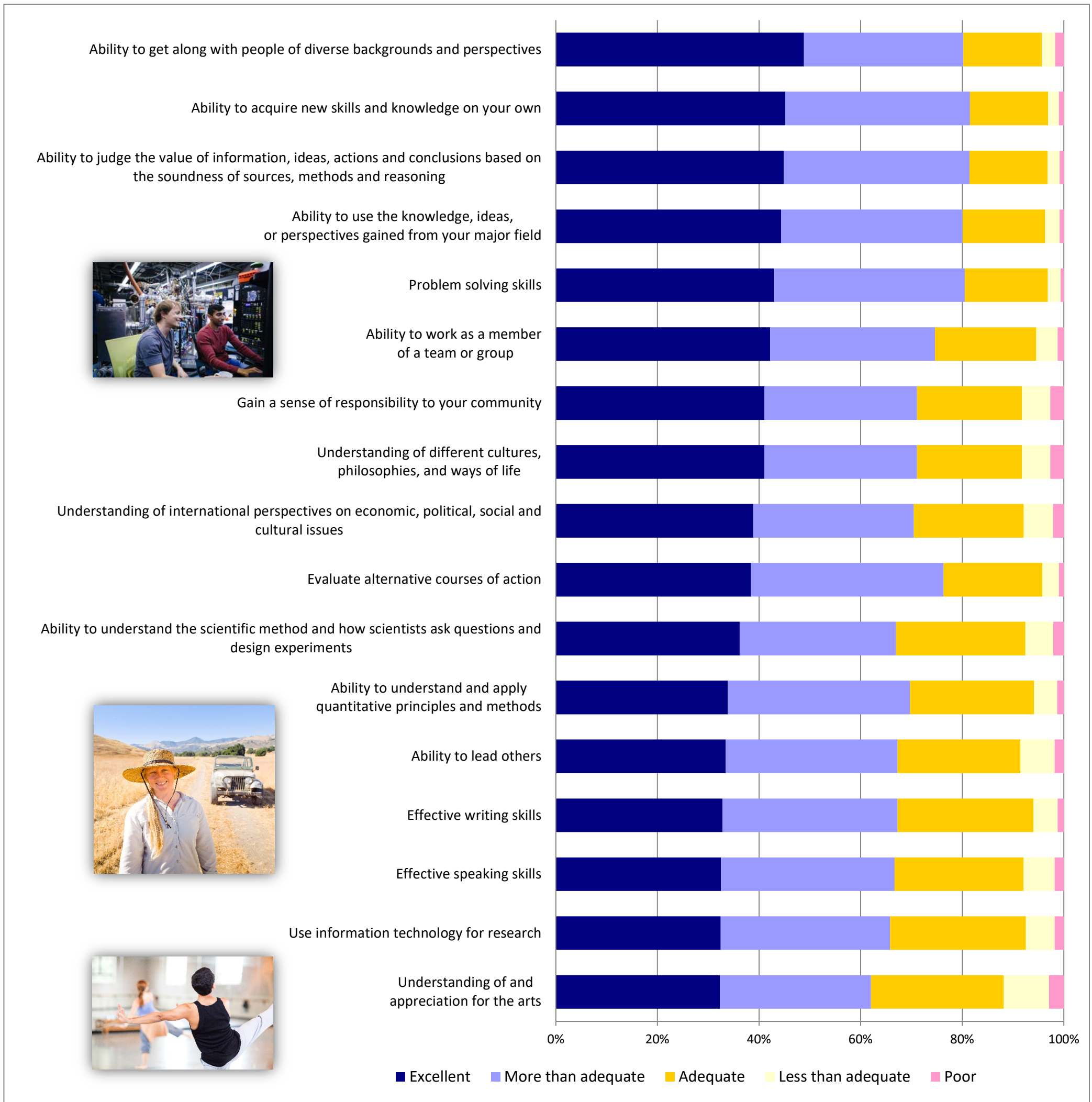
Working for Pay

- 72% of graduating seniors worked at least part-time while at UCSB.
- Only 34% said they needed to work to finance their education.
- Of those that worked, the average number of hours worked per week was 13.44.

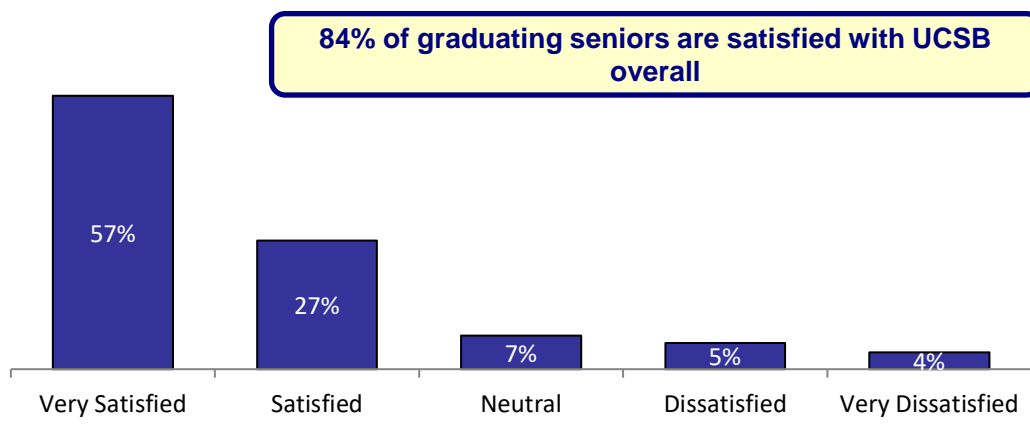
Alumni are most likely to report receiving excellent preparation at UCSB in:

- Understanding of international perspectives on economic, political, social, and cultural issues

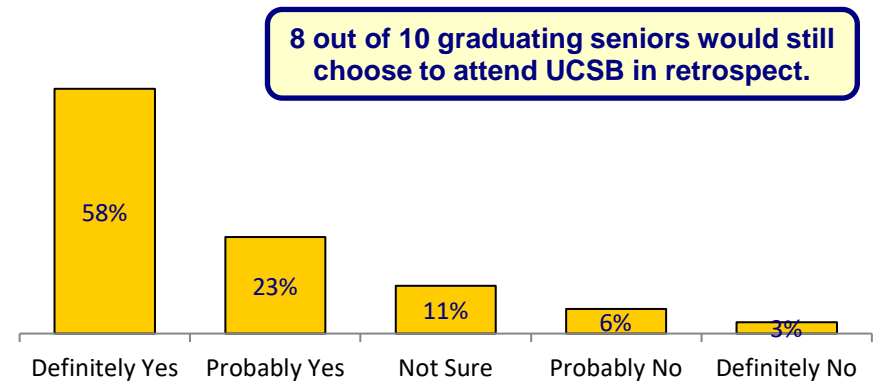

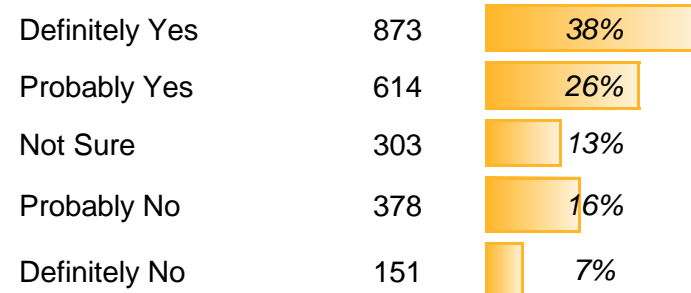
How satisfied are you with UCSB overall?



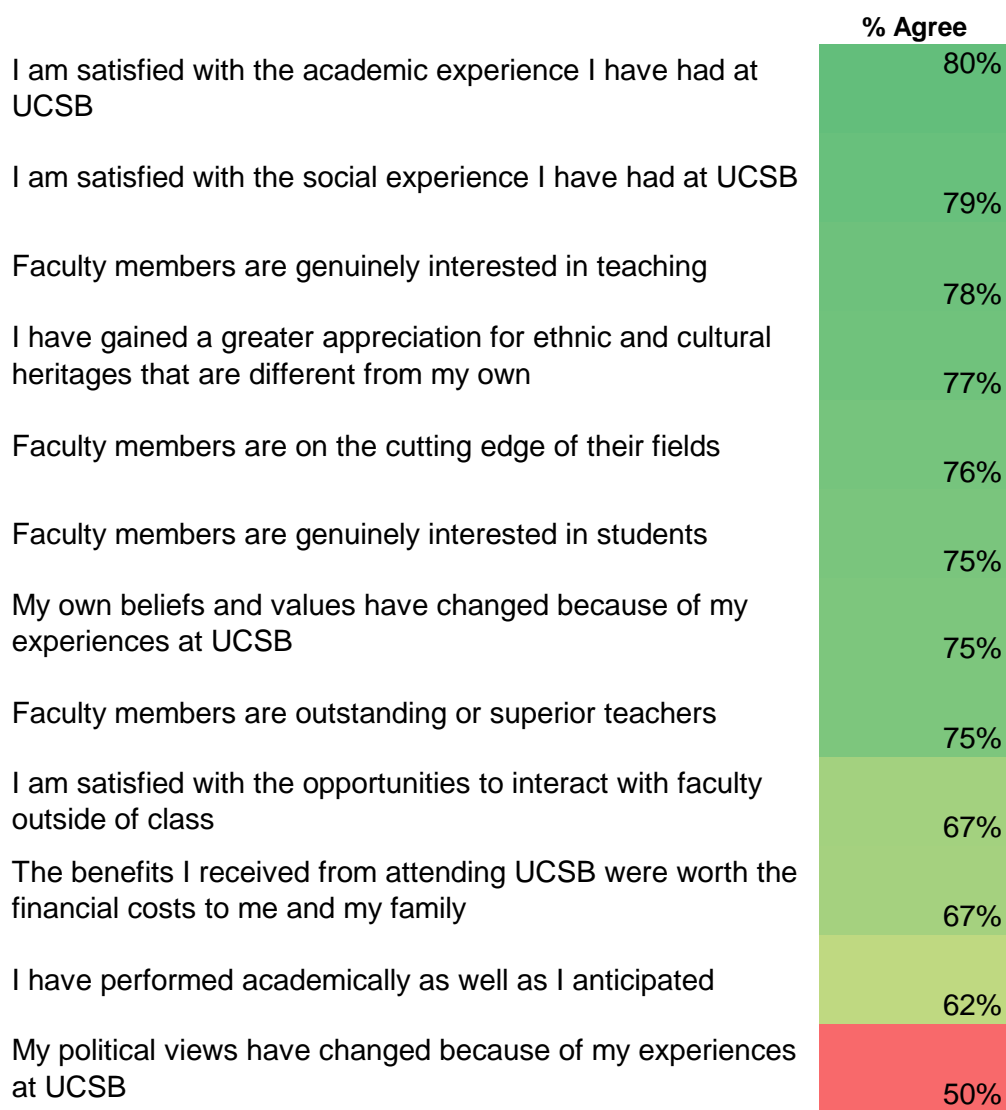
If you could start your undergraduate studies over, would you still choose to attend UCSB?



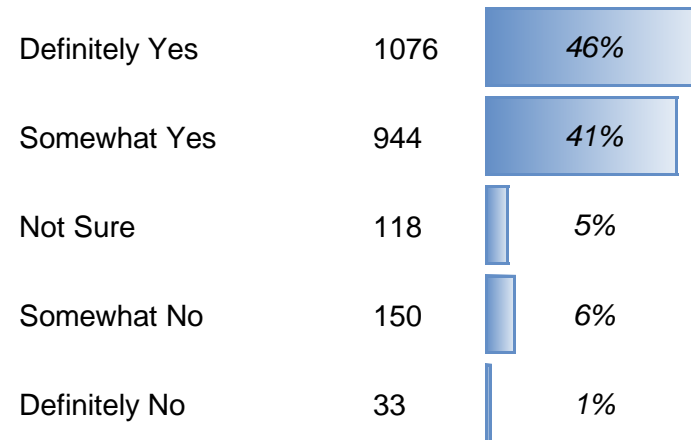
If you could start your undergraduate studies over, would you take the same major?



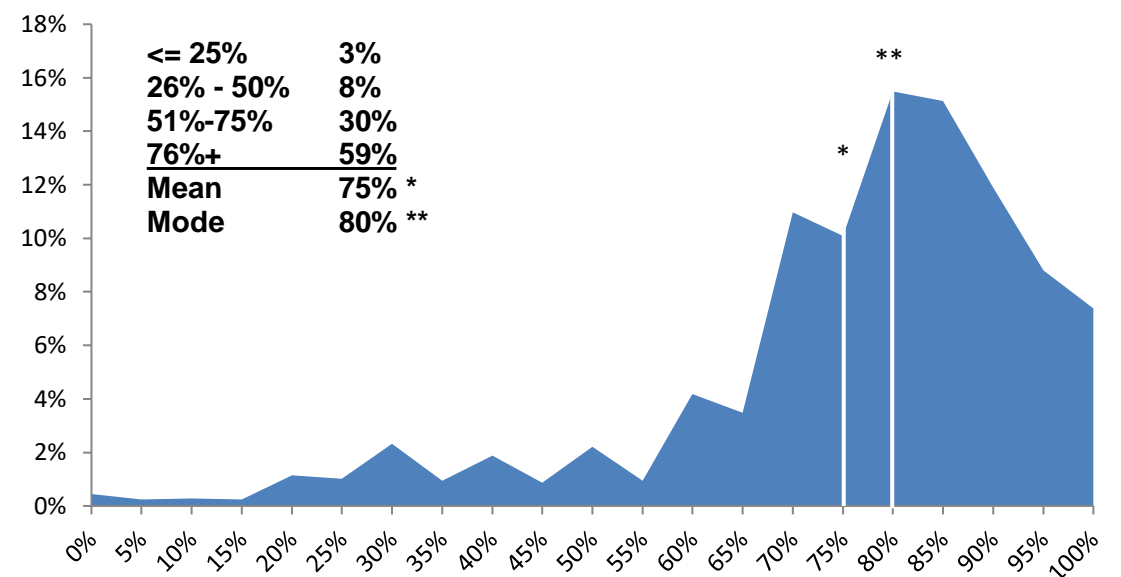
Please indicate the extent to which you agree or disagree with the following statements
